Competition Rules

Essay Length: 1,000 - 1,500 words. Essays should be typed, double-spaced with one-inch margins, 12-point Times New Roman or Arial font in MLA or APA format. Include your student ID and a page number in the footer of each page.

Essay Submission: Submit essay in Microsoft Word or PDF format. Include a cover page with essay title, name, phone number (include area code), email and a 150-250-word personal biography. Entry requires a photo, a completed registration form, copy of DD214 and a [photo/video release form](#).
