PROMPT

Create artworks that explore and expand on this year's theme in innovative ways, such as:

- Highlight social justice issues, address systemic inequalities, and promote activism.
- Pay homage to individuals who speak up against injustices and prompt change.
- Showcase how art itself can be a form of activism, from street art and protest signs to performance art and digital activism.
- Voice-based works that issue a call to action in service of contemporary social issues such as racial equality, gender rights, environmental justice, or civic engagement.

ARTWORK GUIDELINES

- All media is accepted (painting, drawing, photography, sculpture, digital art, musical recordings, poem/spoken word, and video)
- Three-dimensional submissions: no larger than 36" wide x 36" high x 36" deep
- Written submissions: 250–500 words
- Recorded submissions: max 3 minutes
- Artwork must be original

- One \$1,000
- Two \$600

Open to enrolled Moreno Valley College students only. Artists of all backgrounds and skill levels are welcome.
